

FamilyWise is a local nonprofit organization that has been committed to ending family violence and keeping children safe since 1976. We support families who are in crisis or experiencing challenging times by providing direct service and encouragement. We help families build the skills to lead fulfilling lives and hope for a better future.

Our goal is to promote social change by strengthening families and the community through programs that:

Educate parents on skills needed to lead stable lives and provide safe homes for their children.

Empower families to achieve self-sufficiency and to advocate for themselves and their children.

Training & Supervision

Students interning at FamilyWise receive supervision, training and support in multiple ways.

In addition to a direct supervisor, all interns have access to a multi-disciplinary team of specialists to offer support and mentoring. These include experts in family education, child development, children's mental health, family and domestic violence, youth development, parent coaching, and community resources.

Interns complete an orientation process and receive at least six hours of training on specific duties, i.e., documentation, assessment, case formulation, privacy & confidentiality, treatment planning, and client engagement. Interns shadow an experienced practitioner in preparation for assuming their own case load. Additional training opportunities are offered through in-service and regular staff trainings.

All master's level interns are assigned a Clinical Supervisor. We have a full-time Clinical Supervisor on staff and also utilize experts in the field to ensure we can meet credentialing requirements, provide diverse supervision experiences, and access to specialties like trauma informed care, domestic violence, PTSD, children's mental health, and marriage and family therapy. Direct, reflective supervision occurs through individual clinical supervision and through group practice, including weekly case review and weekly cohort meetings.



Time Requirements

Total hours required to complete your internship is determined by your school and academic program. Check with your advisor. FamilyWise requires that all interns complete a minimum of 60 hours. Service learning students are subject to slightly different requirements.

Worksite Locations

Most interns work out of our main Minneapolis office or St. Paul location. FamilyWise has four other sites where supervised visitations are conducted. Interns doing supervised visitation may be asked to conduct visits at these locations in North Minneapolis, Lakeville, Isanti, or Anoka. FamilyWise also offers home-based services.
